Continuing a successful tradition, we are glad to announce GSC'09 - the annual meeting of graduate students in the field of *Control and System Theory* (in the wide sense). The GSC'09 meeting will take place on Monday, April 20, 2009. We are pleased to host it this time at Ben-Gurion University of the Negev, in the Mechanical Engineering Department.

As always, the meeting is intended as a platform for exchanging ideas among students and senior faculty from various departments and institutions in Israel. In more detail, the meeting provides:

4) An opportunity for us, the supervisors, to learn about each other's current research interests.

This year, for the first time, we will be awarding the Velger prize for an outstanding paper, to be selected from those presented in this meeting. This prize has been established jointly by El-Op and IAAC on the name of the late Dr. Marco Velger, a distinguished member of the Israeli control community, who recently passed away. A time slot of 25 minutes, including questions, is allocated for each presentation. Priority will be given to research works that are in their final stages, although significant partial results may well be presented. Please provide, **by March 19**, the material requested below.

We would appreciate your help in spreading this call to relevant faculty who may not be on our list - especially newcomers and researchers with related interests.

The success of the event obviously depends on the participation of both the students and the faculty members, and we hope that you and your students will be able to join us.
