As always, the meeting is intended as a platform for exchanging ideas, on friendly grounds, among students and senior faculty from various departments and institutions in Israel. In more detail, the meeting provides:

- A unique opportunity for graduate students to present their work before a professional audience and obtain feedback on it.
- A chance for the graduate students to observe the work of their peers and get acquainted with the Israeli faculty and Industry in their field.
- A meeting place between Academia and Industry.
- An opportunity for us, the supervisors, to learn about each other's current research interests.

We solicit 25 minutes presentations by students. Priority will be given to graduate students who are in the final stages of their research. However, significant partial results may also be included. Please provide, by **April 18, 2010**, the material requested below.

As last year, we will be awarding the Velger prize for an outstanding paper, to be selected from those presented in this meeting. This prize has been established jointly by El-Op and IAAC on the name of the late Dr. Marco Velger, a distinguished member of the Israeli control community. The winning paper will be selected by a dedicated committee after hearing the presentations. Students who wish to be considered for this prize are encouraged to submit supporting material on the subject matter of their talk, as described below.

The success of the event obviously depends on the participation of both the students and the faculty members, and I hope that you and your students will be able to join us.

We would appreciate your help in spreading this call to relevant faculty who may not be on our mailing list - especially newcomers and researchers with related interests.
