Dear Friends and Colleagues,

Following the exemplary tradition of previous years, we are announcing GSC'11 -- the annual meeting of graduate students in the field of Control and System Theory (in a broad sense).

The GSC'11 meeting will take place on Monday, April 11, 2011. We are pleased to host it this time at the Weizmann Institute of Science, in the Faculty of Mathematics and Computer Science.

As always, the meeting is intended as a platform for exchanging ideas, on friendly grounds, among students and senior faculty from various departments and institutions in Israel. In more detail, the meeting provides:

1. A unique opportunity for graduate students to present their work and obtain feedback on it.
2. A chance for the students to get acquainted with Israeli faculty in their field.
3. A meeting place between Academia and Industry, who are invited to the event, and a chance for the students to meet potential employers.
4. An opportunity for the supervisors to learn about each other's current research interests.

We will be awarding the **Velger prize for an outstanding paper, to be selected from those presented in this meeting**. This prize has been established jointly by El-Op and IAAC on the name of the late Dr. Marco Velger, a distinguished member of the Israeli control community, who recently passed away. The winning paper will be selected by a dedicated committee after hearing the presentations.

Students who wish to be considered for this prize are encouraged to submit supporting material on the subject matter of their talk, as described below, as well as a recommendation letter from the thesis supervisor.

The success of the event obviously depends on the participation of both the students and the faculty members, and I hope that you and your students will be able to join us.

We solicit 20-25 minutes presentations by students. Please provide, **by March 12**, the details requested below.

Priority will be given to presentations reporting on final stages of the research. However, significant partial results may well be included.

We would appreciate your help in spreading this call to relevant faculty who may not be on our list - especially newcomers and researchers with related interests.

We look forward to receiving your contribution.
