CALL FOR PRESENTATIONS

Dear Friends and Colleagues:

Following the tradition of previous years, we are announcing GSC 2012 – the annual meeting of Israeli graduate students in the field of Systems and Control Theory (in the broad sense). The GSC 2012 meeting will take place on Monday, April 30, 2012, with the talks starting approximately at 9:30am, and closing no later than 6pm. We are pleased to host the meeting this time in the Faculty of Engineering, Tel Aviv University, Ramat Aviv, in room 315 of the nice new multi-disciplinary building.

As always, the meeting is intended as a platform for exchanging ideas, on friendly grounds, among students and senior faculty from various departments and institutions in Israel. In more detail, the meeting provides:

1. A unique opportunity for graduate students to present their work and obtain feedback on it.
2. A chance for the students to get acquainted with Israeli faculty in their field.
3. A meeting place between Academia and Industry, who are invited to the event, and a chance for the students to meet potential employers.
4. An opportunity for the supervisors to learn about each other's current research interests.

We will be awarding the **Velger prize for an outstanding paper, to be selected from those presented in this meeting**. This prize has been established jointly by El-Op and IAAC on the name of the late Dr. Marko Velger, a distinguished member of the Israeli control community. Full details of this prize see

The winning paper will be selected by a dedicated committee after hearing the presentations. Students who wish to be considered for this prize must submit (by April 15) a recommendation letter from their thesis supervisor. In addition, they may (but do not have to) submit supporting material concerning their talk, such as a paper they wrote on the same subject.

The success of the event obviously depends on the participation of both the students and the faculty members, and I hope that you and your students will be

able to join us. There is no registration fee.
