



## CALL FOR PRESENTATIONS

Dear Friends and Colleagues,

We are pleased to announce GSC'17 – the annual meeting of graduate students in the field of Control and Systems Theory (in a broad sense). This year the meeting will be held on Monday, May 8, 2017, at the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering, Technion–IIT.

Continuing the exemplary tradition of previous years, this meeting is intended as a casual platform for exchanging ideas among students and senior faculty from various institutions in Israel. It aims at offering graduate students a stage for sharing insight and excitement about their research in front of a professional audience. The meeting also gives students a unique opportunity to learn about the work of their peers, get acquainted with the Israeli faculty in their field, and meet potential industrial employers. Additionally, GSC events serve a meeting place between academia and industry.

We solicit 20–25 minutes presentations by students. Please provide, by April 3, 2017 at 20:00, the following details (as a plain text e-mail message, in English, sent to [mirkin@technion.ac.il](mailto:mirkin@technion.ac.il)):

- ❖ name and affiliation (department and institution),
- ❖ degree program (M.Sc. / Ph.D.) and the expected graduation date,
- ❖ thesis supervisor,
- ❖ talk title,
- ❖ talk abstract (up to 272 words, no bibliography, may contain simple standalone LaTeX code).

Priority, if required, will be given to presentations reporting on final stages of the research and to GSC newcomers.

As in the last eight years, the VELGER PRIZE will be awarded to the best presentation at the meeting. The prize has been established jointly by Elop and IAAC in memory of the late Dr. Marco Velger, a distinguished member of the Israeli control community. Nominations are welcome together with the presentation submissions and should follow the prize regulations, which can be found on the web site of IAAC (<http://iaac.technion.ac.il/education/VelgerPrizeRules.pdf>).

The success of the event depends on the active participation of both the students and the faculty members, so we hope that you and your students will be able to join us. We would also appreciate your help in spreading this call to relevant faculty who may not be on our mailing list, especially newcomers and researchers with adjacent interests.
